2010 ANNUAL REPORT

On behalf of the Board of Directors and the staff of the Children’s Advocacy Center of North and Northwest Cook County, we are pleased to present our annual report for the period beginning July 1, 2009 through June 30, 2010.



Our annual report this year focuses on “outcomes” – the many varied ways that the services we provide impact the lives of children who are victims of abuse and violence and their family members. Each year, more than 400 children in the north and northwest suburbs are reported as victims of sexual abuse or severe physical abuse, and hundreds more witness violence between family members or loved ones. In most situations, our initial contact with the family occurs over the telephone, often in the midst of the crisis of a child’s disclosure of abuse or following an incident of domestic violence. The caring professional staff members of the Children’s Advocacy Center help to diminish the intensity of the crisis and to engage the family in working together with the Center. Through thorough interviewing and assessment, the Center helps to determine whether or not abuse occurred, how the abuse or violence affected the child and her/his family, and what steps need to be taken to ensure the safety of all involved. Once this is accomplished, the Center works to help the child and family heal from their traumatic experiences, to learn that the abuse or violence was not their fault, and that they can control their feelings and their behavior. When the abuse leads to an arrest and criminal charges, the Center works hand in hand with the child and her/his family to ensure they are never alone through this long and very difficult legal process. Ultimately, the outcome we wish for every child and family is a return to normalcy and a life free from abuse and violence.

In the past year, more than 650 children and adults received services through the agency’s Coordination, Advocacy and Sensitive Interviewing, Family Support Services and Safe From the Start Programs. Combined, the Center provided more than 8,975 hours of direct services for abused children and their families, all at no cost to our clients.

However, funding these vital services continues to be very challenging. This past year, the Children’s Advocacy Center, like many service providers, experienced a reduction in funding. The Center responded to the issue by cutting expenses by 9%, at the same time striving to address the growing needs of our children and families. Our Board of Directors, staff and volunteers thank the foundations, townships and municipalities, state agencies, corporations, local civic and philanthropic organizations and individual donors who make our work possible. We look forward to your continuing support and to the Center remaining the healing place for the abused children of our community.

CASI PROGRAM – Coordination, Advocacy and Sensitive Interviewing

The goal behind the CASI program is to coordinate a team of professionals and provide an investigative interview of abuse while assuring the child’s safety and emotional well-being.

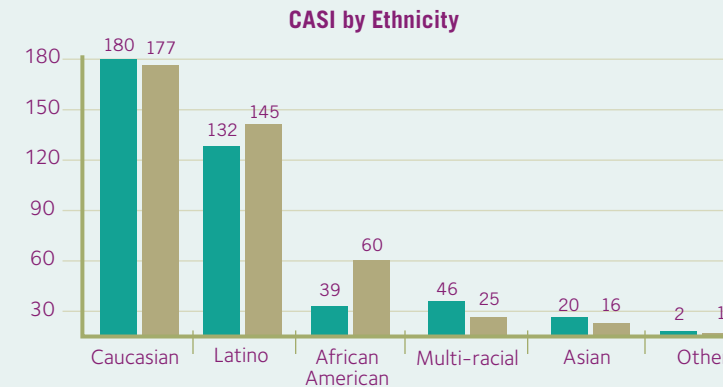
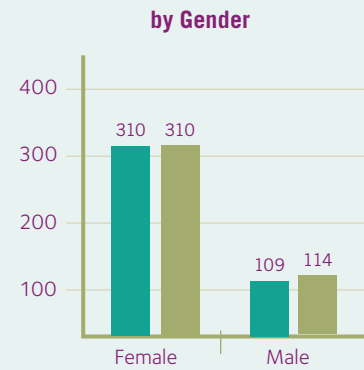
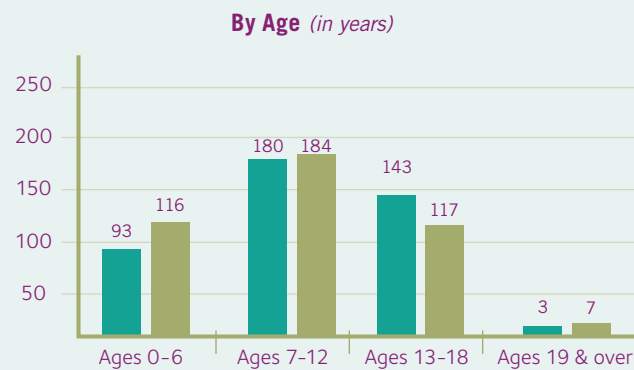
- Instead of going to a police station, The Children’s Advocacy Center provides a safe and developmentally appropriate environment that allows the child to tell her/his story in her/his way.
- One interview with a trained interviewer while the multidisciplinary team comprised of local law enforcement agencies, the Department of Children and Family Services (DCFS), and the State’s Attorney’s Office observe and discuss the allegations, complete the investigation, and determine a plan to assure the child’s safety.
- Elicit factual information where the child is does not feel like an offender.
- An Advocate is assigned to each child to ensure that the child and family’s safety and best interests are protected. The Advocate is a confidant with whom the family may share their frustration, hopelessness, and many other feelings during the recovery period.
- The Advocate serves as a liaison for the child and family during the complicated court proceeding and to help bring justice to the child.

OUTCOMES:

- Disclosure of the abuse reveals the secret life the child has been required to live while the abuse was occurring. Telling her/his story can be liberating.
- The child has affirmation that the abuse is not her fault.
- The abuse is stopped and a process of healing can begin for the child and family.
- The average cost of a CAC investigation is \$2,125 compared to \$3,949 for a non-CAC investigation – a savings of more than \$1,800 per case. Our Center saved our community over \$540,000 in the past year in the 38 villages we serve in North and Northwest Cook County.

F S S PROGRAM – Family Support Services

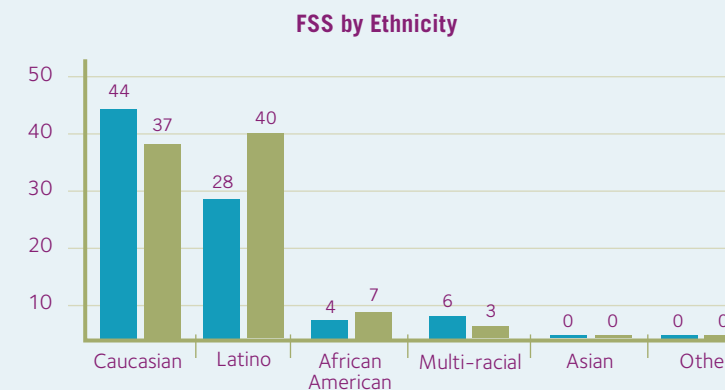
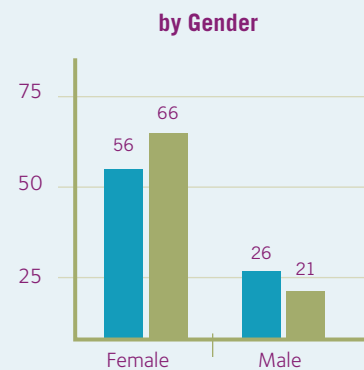
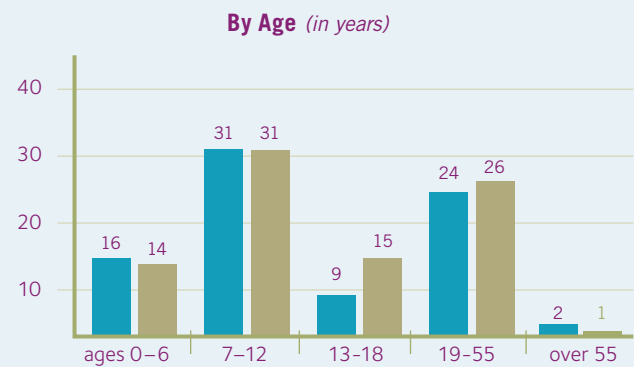
Our Family Support Services Program assesses abuse and related behavior problems and prepares a treatment plan with the tools for the child to be safe and feel safe. In addition to individual and group therapy for our children, we offer Parent Support Groups that meet weekly to provide a supportive, non-judgmental environment for dealing with the emotional aftermath of abuse disclosure. Our services are offered in Spanish, Polish and English.

OUTCOMES:

- Behavioral issues such as bed wetting, tantrums and nightmares are addressed and diminished or eliminated.
- Anger and bullying episodes are reduced in number as the child learns positive ways to direct these behavioral issues.
- Increased self esteem through empowering games and activities during therapy.
- Improved familial relationships as the child feels safer in the home environment.
- Positive coping mechanisms after parents and children attend group therapy and share how they have dealt with the effects of child abuse in their family.
- Our bilingual services provide much needed case planning that addresses the cultural issues, language, legal status and linkages to needed services in the community.

SAFE FROM THE START



The Safe From the Start program aims to reduce the trauma of exposure to violence in children ages 0-5. These services include:

- Centralized intake for referrals from family members or professionals
- Specialized assessment of children ages 0-5 years
- Intensive case management with families
- Therapeutic services such as crisis intervention, therapy and parent education groups

OUTCOMES

While participating in family, group and individual sessions, caregivers will:

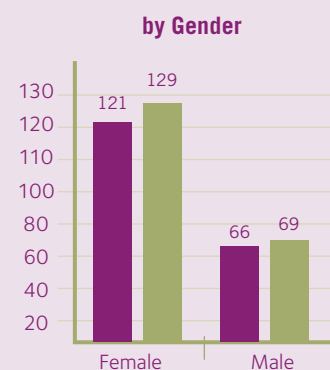
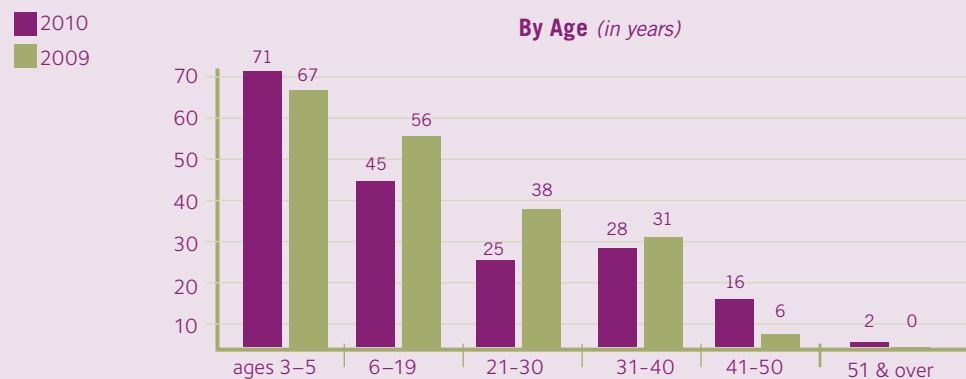
- Increase their understanding of the impact of traumatic events on their children
- Increase their understanding of developmentally appropriate behavior
- Improve their ability to listen to their children express feelings
- Increase their ability to nurture their children
- Develop nurturing, consistent routines for their children
- Decrease stress

While participating in play, parent/child or family therapy, children will:

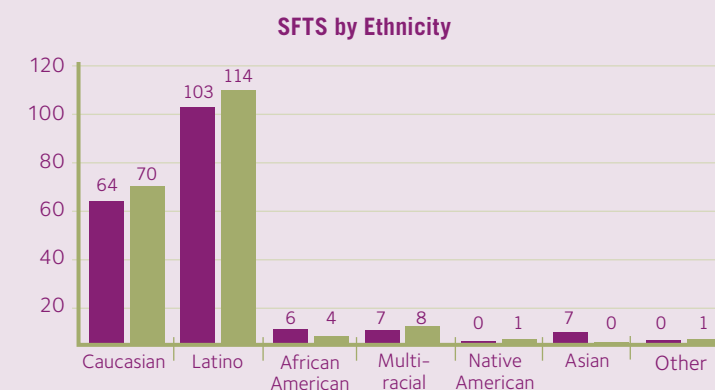
- Improve their ability to identify feelings
- Improve their ability to express their feelings in healthy ways
- Improve their ability to resolve conflict peacefully
- Improve their ability to handle transitions

Additional Services

Each service offered through the CAC is designed to support our warm and welcoming environment.

Medical Clinic

Most medical procedures for children can be a bit scary, particularly in the traumatic aftermath of abuse. To help put the children at ease, our on-site pediatrician, Dr. Afsoon Karimi, provides the necessary medical examinations, treatment and follow-up care at our own medical clinic. To further provide comfort and help answer any questions, we also have the child's Advocate present throughout the process. These services are provided at no cost to the client's family.

Volunteer Program

With the high-level of professional support provided, The Center nevertheless relies heavily on a dedicated corps of volunteers, many of whom work directly with the children, particularly when their parents attend the weekly support group. Others offer their time to help maintain our building and the grounds in order to keep the "Big White House" feeling like home. The Center works with area high schools to provide a volunteer experience for graduating seniors.
